Jesus taught with word pictures, commonly known as parables. Sometimes the pictures seemed strange. For example: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed..." Or, "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven..." These parables in the 13th chapter of Matthew demonstrate how Jesus used common pictures to help listeners remember the point that He was making. Therefore, the techniques used in this course have been used for centuries, and you will experience the joy of Bible study that will last a lifetime. As your confidence with God's Word grows, it will also attract others to want to know the Bible too. Share "The Gospel Memory Course" with them and watch your church grow, spiritually and numerically.

The purpose of this course is to provide Christians of all denominations a creative, effective, and fun way to remember where to find something in the New Testament. Prayer:

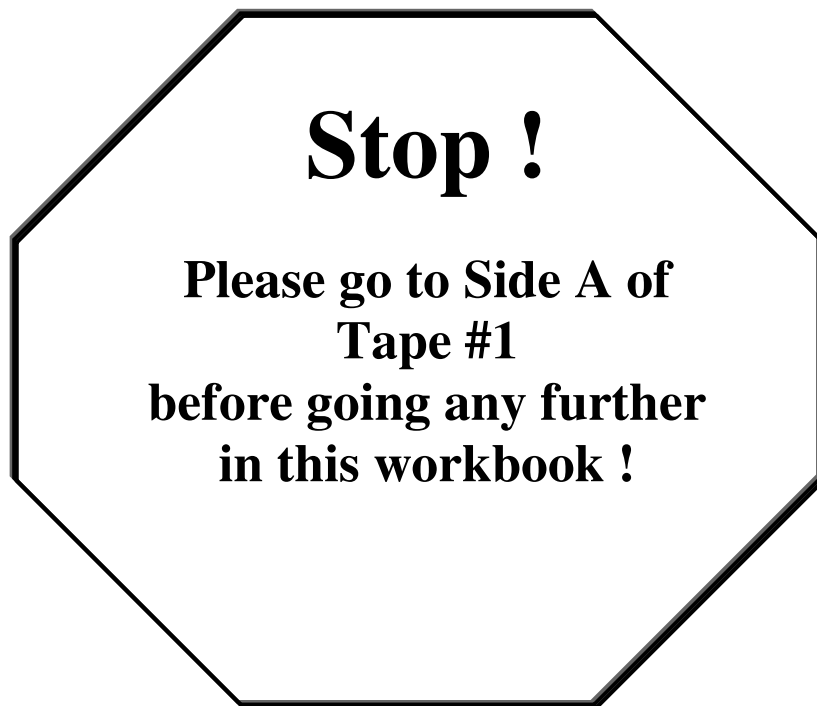

you are a true scholar.
- Tape 3, Side B **(Lesson Six)** *The Gospel According to Matthew*
Matthew has 28 chapters, more than any other book in the New
Testament, except for Acts. The techniques are easy by now,
and you finish with 89 points of reference to your Bible.
- Tape 4, Side A **(Lesson Seven)** *Acts of the Apostles*
Like Matthew, Acts has 28 chapters. It is all downhill after
this. You now have 117 reference points memorized in the
New Testament.
- Tape 4, Side B **(Lesson Eight)** *The Book of Romans*
The first in biblical order of Paul's Epistles, with 16 chapters.
Total of 133 points learned.
- Tape 5, Side A **(Lesson Nine)** *1 & 2 Corinthians*
Paul's Epistles to the church in Corinth. The first has 16 chapters and
the second has 13. Total of 162 points memorized in terms of location,
for easy reference.
- Tape 5, Side B **(Lesson Ten)** *Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians*
Four short epistles of Paul. Galatians has 6 chapters; Ephesians 6;
Philippians 4; and Colossians 4.
Total reference points memorized is 182.

- Tape 6, Side A **(Lesson Eleven)** *1 & 2 Thessalonians, 1 & 2 Timothy, Titus*
Five short epistles of Paul – two to the church in Thessalonica, two to a friend, Timothy, and one to a friend, Titus. 1Thess. has 5 chapters, 2Thess. has 3, 1Tim. has 6, 2Tim. has 4, and Titus has 3.
Total of 203 reference points memorized.
- Tape 6, Side B **(Lesson Twelve)** *Philemon, Hebrews, and James*
Philemon, the last Epistle (agreed upon by scholars) from Paul, has only one chapter. Hebrews, debated by scholars as to the author (many believe it was Paul), has 13 chapters. James has a mere 5 chapters.
Total of 222 chapters that you can reference by memory.
- Tape 7, Side A **(Lesson Thirteen)** *1 & 2 Peter, 1, 2, & 3 John, and Jude*
1 & 2 Peter, authored by the apostle Peter, has 5 chapters in Book 1, 3 in Book 2. 1, 2, & 3 John (same author as the Gospel of John and Revelation) has 7 chapters in all. Jude has only one chapter.
Total of 238 chapters that you can reference by memory.
- Tape 7, Side B **(Lesson Fourteen)** *The Book of Revelation*
Authored by the apostle John, aka John the Revelator.
Revelation has 22 chapters, for a total of 260 chapters in the entire New Testament.
- Tape 8, Side A **(Lesson Fifteen)**
A walk through the New Testament reviewing only the biblical reference points. It is done without the memory "pegs" to test and review. Done slow enough for most to manage, but fast enough to challenge. Designed to be used as a refresher – while driving, doing housework, etc.
- Tape 8, Side B **(Lesson Sixteen)**
Like Side A, this side is designed to be a refresher, or review exercise. Following the "Self Test" in the workbook, this exercise asks where a topic is found and gives a short time to respond.

Lesson Fifteen

This lesson is a review of the entire New Testament, found on Side 1 of Tape #8. In this lesson, we go through each chapter quickly, without the silly stories. Your mind will see the story and give you the memory points much quicker than you can speak them. Whenever possible, listen to the tape and see how well you keep up. An alternative is to walk through the New Testament in your mind, without speaking – just seeing, and moving on. You will be amazed!

Finally, I would encourage you to learn with friends and family members, and make a game out of it whenever and wherever possible. It is a great pastime for traveling as a family. For example, have one of the children do the Book of Mark backwards, have another do the Book of John. My wife and I call this the memory game. It is fun, challenging, and will turn a long trip into a fun trip.
